Realtors Association Surveys Country for Detailed Buyer, Seller Information

Every 2 years for the last 27 years the National Association of Realtors conducts a detailed

survey of home buyers and home sellers focusing on the home buying and selling process and peoples' reaction to the process. The 2018 report is out in massive detail. In my article about the report I won't go deeply into details but rather, highlight some of the information you'll find interesting. Keep in mind this research was for the entire country.



On the home buyer side of the equation:

- 33% of all buyers were buying their 1st home
- The typical buyer was 46 years old and had an average annual income of \$51,600
- 88% found the internet as the best source of info
- 78% of buyers reported their real estate agent was a very useful information source
- 87% of buyers used a real estate agent and 6% bought directly from a builder's rep. 90% would use their agent again.
- Detached single family homes were were the choice of 82% of homebuyers with townhomes, condo's and duplexes filling in the balance.
- There was a median distance of only 15 miles between the old and new homes
- The median price was \$250,000 and 1900 sq. ft.

On the home seller side:

- The typical home seller was 55 years old with a family income of \$98,800
- The most common reason for selling was to get a bigger home followed by getting closer to friends and family, and job relocation.
- Sellers had typically lived in their homes for nine years before selling
- 91% of sellers worked with an agent to sell their home
- Sellers reported they were on the market for 3 weeks before accepting an offer
- 44% of all sellers offer some type of incentive such as paying a portion of buyers closing costs, providing a home warranty, appliances or decorating allowance, etc.
- Home sellers on the average sold their home for \$55,000 more than they paid for it.

These are national statistics and don't apply precisely to our market but to us at Ayers Realtors they surprisingly conform in more ways than not.

Miller 2018 Housing Market Robust Even Without Lakefront Sales

The statistics included in this section of the

newsletter are from the Greater Northwest Indiana Association of Realtors MLS. Because the high priced houses and the lower



priced houses in all neighborhoods are included, the average for your specific neighborhood will be substantially different.

The 2018 year end real estate statistics are now available for the Miller market area within the National Park boundaries. There were 76 home sales reported. This total of 76 is up from 2017 when there were 69.

Bank owned sales of homes are becoming less of a factor in our market after several years of repo sales being a substantial percentage of the market. The highwater mark was in 2011 at 50%. Since then, the percentage has been decreasing to 25.7% in 2016, 16% in 2017 and only 3.9% in 2018.

The average list price in 2018 was \$195,236, an increase from \$178,299 in 2017. The average sales price was up correspondingly from \$169,640 in 2017 to \$185,935 in 2018. As has been a market fact for the last several years, the average sales price of the repos, \$45,567 compared to the average sales price of the non-repo home sales at \$191,704 has had an effect on the statistic.

Lakefront property sales prices are always dramatically higher than all properties not directly on the water. Therefore, in 2017 the 7 lakefront sales really boosted the average sales price for all properties. In 2018 there were 3 lakefront sales to boost the overall average. Usually if there are 7 lakefront sales one year and only 3 such sales the next, the overall average sales price for the area would drop. However, in 2018 the market was so robust the average sales price as reported above still saw a substantial increase.

Another very encouraging market fact was the resurgence of vacant lots sales. Since the real estate crash that began in late 2007 very few lots have changed hands; some years none. In 2017 there were 8 lot sales. In 2018 there were 21 lot sales and Ayers Realtors handled 16 of the listings.

Finally, Ayers Realtors has approximately three and a half times the volume of sales as the nearest competitor with 46% of the market share with an average market time of 41 days compared to other offices combined market time of 83 days. 


